







Sterling's Regional Economy


• "I need/want to live in Rice County and Sterling is the best choice."	4.78

- Addition of historical lighting to Peace, Evergreen, and/or Dysart Parks 38.9


Possible Park Improvements


Impression of Sterling Employees





"In your opinion what is the best way to let citizens like yourself know about city programs, events, policies, news, etc?"







Future City Funding

1.	Attract and keep young families. Market and promote the city as a great place to live and work.	A. Citizens believe that Sterling is a safe place to live, work, and raise a family. Market the community as a safe place. B. Citizens believe that they have excellent quality schools. Market the community emphasizing its high quality schools. C. Citizens believe that Sterling is a beautiful city. Market Sterling using a "Small is Beautiful and Safe" theme.

	Priorities	Recommendations
2.	Continue to improve Sterling's downtown area. Promote redevelopment of commercial properties.	Citizens want (1.) Restaurants, (2.) Thrift Store e.g. Dollar General, (3.) Bookstore/Coffee shop. Use Community Ad Hoc Committees to examine these options.
3.	Maintain quality City services. Provide cost-effective City services that meet the needs of users.	This supports priority #1.
4.	Citizens believe that Sterling is a great place to live in retirement.	Market Sterling emphasizing this theme.

	Priorities	Recommendations
5.	Most citizens want opportunities to become involved and serve the City of Sterling.	Create new opportunities and activities for citizen involvement.
6.	Citizens believe that police and fire department responses to emergencies are excellent.	This supports priorities #1, #3, and #4.
7.	Citizens believe that the City pool and parks are excellent.	This supports priorities #1, #3, and #4.

	Priorities	Recommendations
8.	Citizens believe that there need to be after school activities for young children and teens.	Focus groups mentioned ballet and tap dance lessons, arts and craft classes (pottery, drawing, & painting), movies, and sports. Have an instructor teach a class a few times a week. Citizen groups should look into these possibilities.
9.	Citizens raised questions about the smoothness of paved City streets.	Can street surfaces be improved? Citizen groups should look into these possibilities.
10.	Citizens believe that recreation and other amenities are not very good.	Can recreation amenities be improved? Citizen groups should look into these possibilities.

	Priorities	Recommendations
11.	Several citizens were concerned about the quality of City water.	Can the City take actions to improve the quality of water?
12.	Several citizens want alcohol e.g. a glass of wine with dinner.	Should the City Council address the issue of allowing alcohol sales?

Priorities/Recommendations

- For further analysis, I would ultimately recommend a smaller version of the existing survey (Appendix B) be sent out with resident's water bill. This would provide a cost effective way to gather information and would also provide a larger demographic representation of the Sterling, Kansas population.
